

Do I need to provide an ID?

No. The signature on your official return envelope will be used to verify your ID.

Mailing Information

The US Postal Service (USPS) needs time to process and deliver your ballot. Therefore, we recommend personally delivering your ballot to any of the locations listed below. It is a violation of law to receive more than ten ballots for mailing or delivery in any election. All valid ballots are counted in the same manner, regardless of the closeness or outcome of any race.

If you do return your ballot through the USPS, you must affix adequate postage to your envelope.

Where can I drop off my ballot or vote in person?

Voter Service & Polling Centers (VSPCs) – Oct 25 to Nov 2, 2021

Rifle Branch Office – 195 W 14th St Bldg. D, room 119 – M-F 8:30 am to 5 pm
Both sites open Saturday, Oct 30, 2021 from 10 am to 2 pm
Both sites open Election Day, Nov 2, 2021 from 7 am to 7 pm

24/7 drop-off boxes: Oct 9 to Nov 2, 2021

Carbondale Town Hall – near main entrance
Glenwood Springs at County Courthouse on 8th St
New Castle Town Hall – near main entrance
Silt Town Hall – near main entrance
Parachute Town Hall – near main entrance
Rifle near entrance of County Admin building at 195 W 14th St., Bldg. D

Drop-off Locations: Oct 11 to Nov 2, 2021

County Courthouse in Glenwood Springs – East Entrance – M-F 7:30 am to 5 pm

Election Day Only VSPCs: Nov 2, 2021 – open 7 am to 7 pm

Carbondale Town Hall, New Castle Library, Silt Library, Parachute Library

ADA accessible voting machines are available at any VSPC listed above.

Secrecy Sleeve / Voter Instructions

What is in my ballot packet?

- Your official ballot
- This secrecy sleeve with voter instructions
- An official return envelope

Need a replacement ballot?

Call 970-384-3700 Ext. 1770 or visit any VSPC. The last day for the County Clerk's Office to mail you a replacement is October 25.

How do I vote my ballot?

Follow all of the voting instructions on your ballot: After you vote:

1. Refold your ballot
2. Place your ballot inside of this secrecy sleeve
3. Place the secrecy sleeve and ballot in the official return envelope
4. Sign and date the self-affirmation located on your own official return envelope. See the example below:

Important:

- You must sign the affirmation on the envelope.
- Do not sign, initial, or print your name on the ballot.
- The official return envelope may only contain your ballot. If you include another voter's ballot in the same envelope, none of the ballots will count.

How do I return my ballot?

- Drop it off at a county-controlled drop box
- Deliver it to a VSPC
- Mail it back
- The County Clerk's Office must receive your ballot by 7:00 PM on Election Day. Postmarks do not count.



How can I track my ballot?

You can go to www.govotecolorado.gov, call us at 970-384-3700 Ext. 1770 to confirm that we received your ballot or visit <https://colorado.ballottrax.net> to sign up for alerts when we receive, accept and count your ballot. You may select the types of messages you want to receive, when during the day you want to receive them or stop receiving them altogether, if you prefer.
