Subject: Cause & Manner of Death for October 18, 2017 Glenwood Springs, CO death investigation involving Mary Kent & Joseph Llewellyn.

On October 18, 2017 the Glenwood Springs Police Department was dispatched to a residence in Glenwood Springs for a report of a male (Llewellyn) who was deceased. Upon arrival, police found Llewellyn deceased and a female (Kent) alive and in another room. Kent had suffered a gunshot wound to the head and was subsequently transported to a Denver area hospital where she died on October 28, 2017.

The Garfield County Coroner's Office and the Glenwood Springs Police Department initiated an investigation utilizing the Colorado Bureau of Investigations (CBI) for crime scene assistance. In addition, several samples were sent to CBI for DNA analysis. The samples sent to CBI confirmed that there was no evidence of a third person at the residence who could have contributed to the death of Kent or Llewellyn.

Furthermore, physical and medical evidence from the scene investigation and autopsies are clear and convincing that Mr. Llewellyn shot Mrs. Kent in the head and then shot himself in the head.

The cause and manner of death for Joseph Llewellyn:

Cause: Gunshot wound of the head.

Manner: Suicide

The cause and manner of death for Mary Kent:

Cause: Gunshot wound of the head.

Manner: Homicide
