Public Meeting for County Line Project to be held next week

GLENWOOD SPRINGS, Colo. – The Aspen-Sopris Ranger District on the White River National Forest invites members of the public to an open-house meeting to ask questions and discuss the upcoming County Line Project. **The public meeting will be held Oct. 3 from 5:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. at the Glenwood Springs Library located at 3427, 815 Cooper Ave, Glenwood Springs, CO 81601.**

“We look forward to hearing what the public thinks about the project,” said Kevin Warner, acting District Ranger. “We encourage folks to stop by the Library, ask questions and gather more information as we begin to move through the NEPA process.”

About the Project: The project area encompasses approximately 33,000 acres within the Fourmile Creek, Camp Creek-East Divide Creek, Thompson Creek and Edgerton Creek-Crystal River watersheds southwest of Glenwood Springs and west of Carbondale, CO. The County Line project was developed to address forest health in the Fourmile Park area; additional components of the project will improve recreation opportunity and public safety, ski area forest health and the existing road system. The County Line project will provide commercial forest products and/or biomass to local industries and will use prescribed fire to improve wildlife habitat while reducing the area’s susceptibility to large-scale wildfire.
